Over 80% of all carbon monoxide (CO) deaths and injuries in Ontario occur in homes.

Known as the "silent killer" CO is a poisonous gas that you cannot see, smell, or taste.

- Furnace
- Stove
- Water heater
- Portable fuel heater

BE SAFE.

A working carbon monoxide alarm can detect CO in your home and will warn you and your family.

PROTECT YOUR FAMILY.

- Ensure all fuel-burning appliances and vents are inspected annually.
- Install CO alarms outside of all sleeping areas if your home has a fuel-burning appliance, fireplace or attached garage.
- Test CO alarms monthly and change batteries at least once a year.
